

Possible routes for Amanda:

- Amanda completes her Foundation Apprenticeship and Highers and secures accelerated entry to a Modern Apprenticeship with a local Financial Services company
- Amanda could also consider applying to university to study a degree in a Financial Services related subject e.g. Accounting. She would probably have to leave home to attend university
- Alternatively, Amanda could explore options for a related Graduate Level Apprenticeship in Financial Services



Possible routes for Ahmed:

- Ahmed could apply for a four year Bachelor of Education (BEd) degree course in Primary Education
- Alternatively, after completing an undergraduate degree in another subject, Ahmed could apply for a one year Professional Graduate Diploma in Education (PGDE) course
- The universities will want to see evidence that Ahmed has studied at least two of the following subjects: Science, Social Studies, Expressive Arts, Religious and Moral Education, Technology and Modern Languages



Possible routes for Heather:

- Nearby college offers Access to Hospitality course which can lead on to SVQs in Hospitality subjects
- Modern Apprenticeship in Hospitality, could work as a professional cook or chef or in food production with a local firm
- Get an entry level job in the kitchen of a local restaurant lots nearby as she lives in the city



Possible routes for Ivy:

- Leave school before Highers and do an NQ in Graphic Design, leading on to an HNC / HND, travelling to the college nearby
- Modern Apprenticeship in Creative and Digital Media, where you can learn as you work as a graphic designer – would probably have to move to a city
- Stay on to study English and Art and apply direct to HND at nearby college
- Stay on for Highers then move away to Art College to do a degree in Graphic Design or Visual Communication

Possible routes for Keith:

- Keith could try going straight from school to work in a hairdressers. If he starts in an entrylevel position, he could try and work his way up
- Alternatively, he could look for a salon where he could work as a Modern Apprentice. Then he'd be able to learn new skills on the job, and get the training he wants
- A third option would be to look for a college course in hairdressing or hair styling. This
 would let him develop his skill, but he might get less practical experience than through a
 Modern Apprenticeship



Possible routes for Kevin:

- Dream job wants to be a footballer. Has connections through his team to get a tryout.
 There's also a Modern Apprenticeship in Excellence in Sport, but this is competitive to get into and he would have to move away
- Modern Apprenticeship Active Leisure, Learning and Wellbeing. With this MA, he could work as an activity leader or assistant coach in a nearby town
- · College Local college offers an HND in Sports Coaching and Development
- Uni BA (Hons) Sports Development at a uni he'd need to move away for



Possible routes for Simon:

- Start running his own website design business full-time from home
- Travel to nearby uni to study computing
- Modern Apprenticeship in Computers and Information Technology (jobs include business analyst, customer service support, software developer, web designer)
- Local college offers HNC/HND in Business which could help him prepare to set one up
