



Aim

- Be aware of what an apprenticeship is.
- To examine the different qualifications/jobs you can gain through an apprenticeship.
- To understand that anyone can go do an apprenticeship if they want to do so.
- To understand what you do within an apprenticeship and why people would do them.

Learning intention

I will be able to identify what an apprenticeship is; what they involve and who does them.

Success criteria

- I can explain what an apprenticeship is.
- I am aware that an apprenticeship is an option for anyone who wants to do one.
- I can identify various routes into employment.
- I can discuss and make decisions about my own career.

Duration

Suitable for

This lesson is suitable for S1-S3 pupils. With follow on support via Careers Advisers and Industry engagement in senior phase S4-S6.









Suggested activities

- <u>Individual pupil format:</u> task each student individually to answer a specific question or all
 the questions and then feedback to the rest of the class as you go through the
 PowerPoint. Pupils can create a mind map or keep a note of their answers as bullet
 points. Tell the pupils not to focus on being right but rather what they think the answer isto
 each of these questions.
- Group format: Split the pupils into groups of 2-5 and using the PowerPoint ask them to
 consider the questions on screen. There areseveral ways to run this activity. You can ask
 the pupils to discuss their answers; create a mind map or keep a note of their answers as
 bullet points. Tell the pupils not to focus on being right but rather what they think the
 answer is to each of these questions.
- Pupils can utilise <u>www.apprenticeships.scot</u> to find out more regarding the different apprenticeships on offer.
- Once the pupils have had the time to consider/write down their answers go over the
 questions together using the PowerPoint.Remember that the task was not to get the
 answers right, but to communicate what the pupils thought about apprenticeships.

Next steps and related activities

- Pupils can use their discussion/notes/mind maps from the lesson as the basis of an 'apprenticeship' poster activity including Apprenticeships are for everyone.
- Pupils can go to <u>www.apprenticeships.scot</u> to explore apprenticeships further and they can speak to their Careers Adviser for more details.
- Pupils can explore their networks to see if any family members or friends have experience of apprenticeships.
