Aims

- Have greater awareness of the qualifications needed for different career pathways.
- Be aware of the differences and similarities between different post-school destinations.

• I will have a greater awareness and understanding of different post-school destinations and how they relate to different career pathways.

Success criteria

- I have an awareness of different postschool destinations.
- I understand the similarities and difference between different post-school

Suggested activities

- Show pupils the PowerPoint and let them know that today you will be focusing on college, university and apprenticeships.
- Split the pupils into groups of 2-4 and ask each group to focus on one of the three destinations. Ask each group to collectively come up with everything they know about the destination. If easier to facilitate, this activity can also be done individually.
- Pupils can present the information in a variety of ways. E.g. group presentation or poster, depending on the time frame and resources available to facilitate the activity.
- Once the pupils have had the opportunity to present their answers there are slides with key points about each post-school destination.

Next steps and related activities

- Ask pupils to look up a job they are interested in on My World of Work and find out the qualifications you would need to do that job.
- Do the follow up lesson, "1.4: Life at..."
