Aims

- · To develop research and communication skills
- To understand the role of local services and how they can contribute to my local community
- To examine and understand tasks undertaken in a particular job

Learning intention

• I will understand the role of local services and how the jobs within them can contribute to my local community

Success criteria

- I can identify different jobs in my community and what they involve
- I can understand the importance of these jobsin my community

Before you start

Duration

These are suggested timescales only and will vary dependent on your group: 60 minutes + (will vary considerably if visitsout with school are undertaken)







What do they do here?

Suitable for

This lesson is suitable for Second level but maybe more appropriate for P5/P6

Suggested activities

- Ask who might help you in the future e.g. at secondary school (elicit careers adviser)
- Explain that in one area of work you may have many types of jobs/roles e.g at school, a hospital, building site, supermarket
- Write up headings for school, sport and leisure, community centre or your own chosen area. Mind map how many types ofjobs the young people can think of for each category
- Divide class into groups and issue theappropriate quizzes
- Ask groups to complete the quiz using existing knowledge, online resources or prearranged visits/ interviews
- Bring class together and discuss findings

Next steps and related activities

- Give each group a scenario to discuss e.g. closure of community centre/library, a reduction in number of classroom assistants. Groups to show the skills and benefits that make these roles important and make a case to present to the class about why the proposed cuts should not happen
