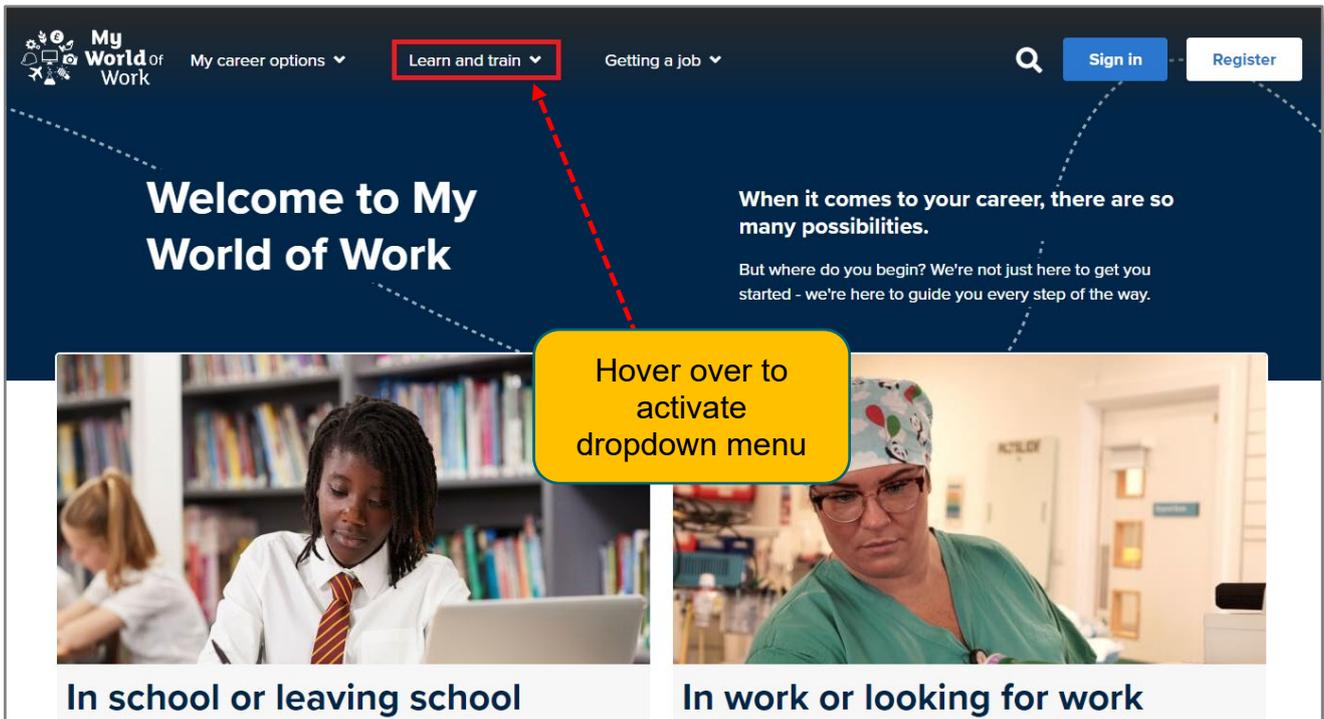
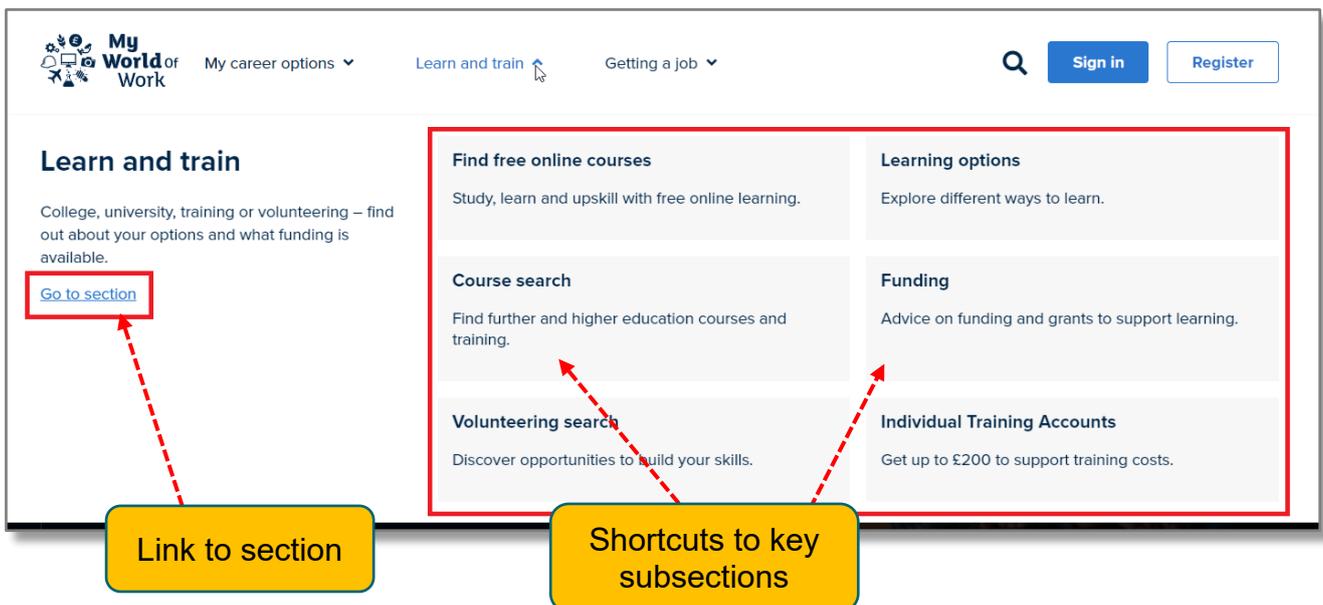


Learn and train

APPENDIX:

The Course and Volunteering search function uses a basic keyword search, and as such there are standard web conventions involved in searching multiple words:

Search text	Returns results where....	Example number of results
Flower	the word flower appears in <i>either</i> the title or the details	11
Arranging	the word arranging appears in <i>either</i> the title or the details	21
Flower arranging	EITHER the word flower OR the word arranging appears in <i>either</i> the title or the details	27 *
“Flower arranging” (in inverted commas)	BOTH the word flower and the word arranging appear TOGETHER in <i>either</i> the title or the details	5

* Note this will not be the same as the total of Flower and Arranging added together because some results will have both words, and will have been counted in results for both individual words.

Whatever search term is used, the results will be returned in “relevance” order – in other words, the more often the word or phrase appears in the result, the higher up it will appear in the list.

To sort in either alphabetical order, or by closest location if you specified a location in your search, use the selection drop-down at the top right of the results page.

As an example, a search for “flower arranging” might return results like “Millinery: Beginners (Evening Class)” and “Conduct the Internal Verification Process” – both of which might appear unrelated to the search term used. However, the first course mentions “Silk Flower Making”, and the second includes “Arranging and conducting internal verification”, so they are both actually correct.

It is impossible for the site to know the intended context of a word when used in a search, so it will return that word or term from whatever context. This does not mean the search results are wrong, but where the word is quite common and can be used in a number of situations (e.g. “Arranging”) it might be worth using a more specific word or phrase.
