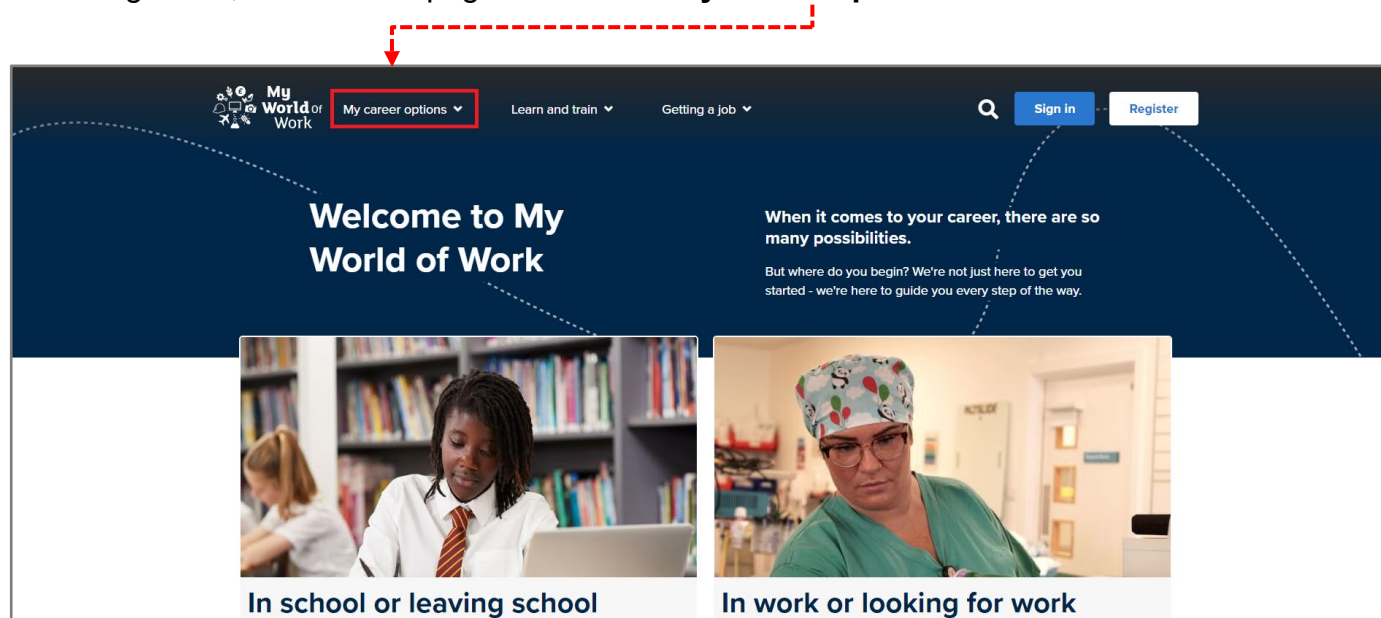
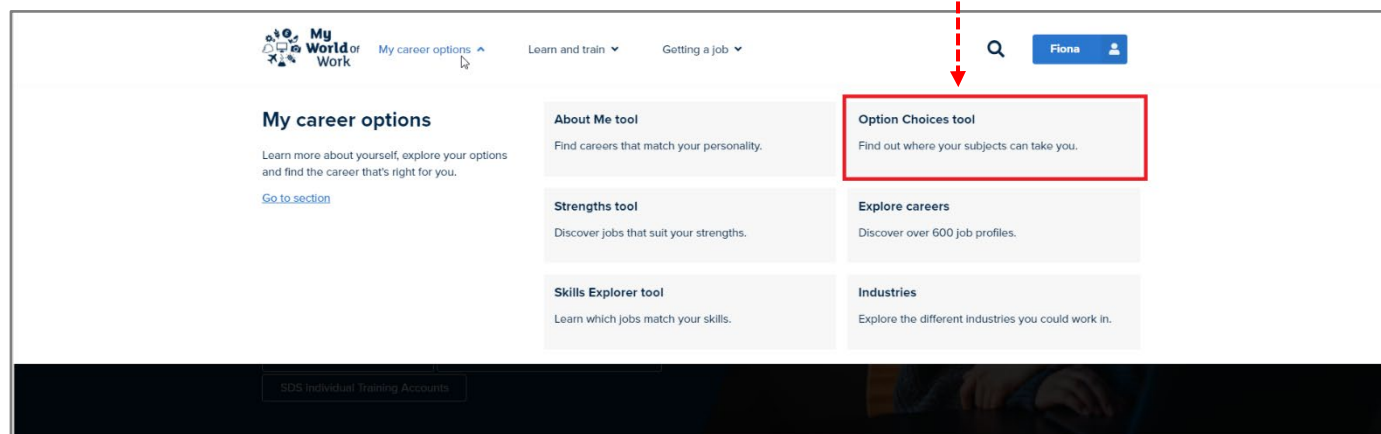


## Option Choices

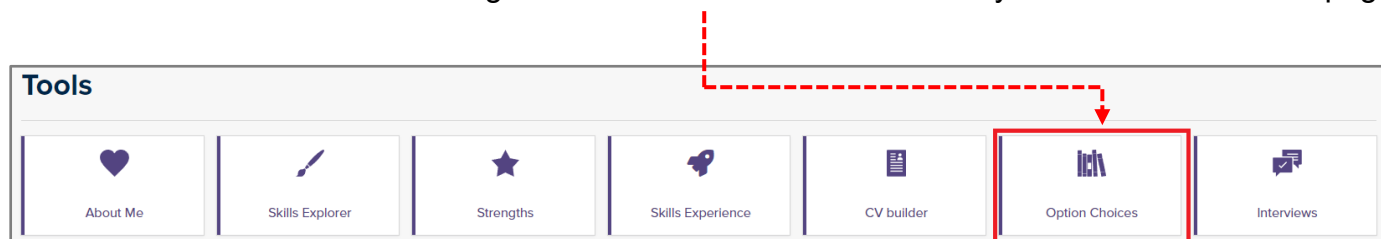
When signed in, on the homepage hover over **'My career options'**


