

# Choosing your subjects

## Lesson Plan

### Aim

For young people to know what factors to consider when making subject choices and learn how to use the Subject Choices tool to support their decisions.

### Learning Outcomes

Young people will understand how:

- ★ to access information about subject choice on My World of Work
- ★ to use the Subject Choices tool
- ★ different combinations of subjects can lead to different career suggestions

### Development of Activity

#### Introduction – Context of lesson

In this activity pupils will be introduced to resources to support them with subject choice. Choosing subjects is a big decision. It can have an impact on career opportunities in the future.

This activity will introduce pupils to the Subject Choices tool and allow them to explore different combinations of subjects and how these link to job opportunities.

### Using the Subject Choices tool

- ★ Click on 'Use the Subject Choices tool' to discover jobs that might suit you based on subjects selected: [www.myworldofwork.co.uk/tools/subject-choices](http://www.myworldofwork.co.uk/tools/subject-choices)
- ★ You can use the 'Subject Choices tool user guide' below to help you
- ★ You can enter up to six school subjects to explore how combinations of subjects can return different career suggestions
- ★ Once you have entered the names of subjects that you wish to explore click 'Show my career options'
- ★ Results will show a range of job profiles, industries and apprenticeships where your chosen subjects are useful
- ★ Check under each job profile which subjects would be useful
- ★ Take time to explore these options further. Which job profiles do you find interesting? Is there any you would like to consider in the future?
- ★ Bookmark any job profiles you find interesting. This will be saved to your account page
- ★ Try other combinations of subjects to see if job suggestions change

### Tips to help you

- ★ Remember your networks and who is available to support you with subject choices – this could be your school Careers Adviser, a Teachers, an older sibling or a parent/carer
- ★ It's your decision – It is important to think about your strengths and interests!
- ★ Have you completed your core tools (About Me, Strengths and Skills Explorer)? The results will show if there are matches to these too.
- ★ If you have completed the Strengths tool check out the report which will also highlight relevant subjects which are suited to your strengths

### Follow-up

Young people can continue to make use of the tool to search for job ideas based on subject choice. If pupils have not already done so they can complete the core tools: About Me, Strengths and Skills Explorer. This will offer more personalised career suggestions.
