## **Development of Activity**

#### Introduction - Context of lesson

The young person should understand that throughout their time in school, young people will be able to use My World of Work as a resource to support them with their career education.

By using My World of Work young people will understand the various routes into career pathways and how to find out more about various options available.

#### Before you start

- ★ Sign into your My World of Work account www.myworldofwork.co.uk
- ★ If you do not have an account, click 'register' at the top right-hand side of the page. If you need help to do this, watch this **video** on how to register

## Task 1: What are my post school options?

- ★ What could be your next step after school?
- ★ Think about the different options that are available for school leavers
- ★ Click on the links below to find out more about some of the options available:

#### Task 2: Researching career options by exploring job profiles

- ★ Click on the 'My career options' section in My World of Work
- ★ If you have completed any of your core tools (About Me, Strengths and Skills Explorer), you can pick a job profile to explore from 'View your career suggestions'
- ★ Alternatively, you can search for job profiles, using the I have a career in mind tab
- ★ Now that you have selected a job profile, scroll down until you reach the section 'Create a qualification route'
- ★ You can use the 'Exploring qualification routes guide' below to help you

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- ★ Select 'Discover my route' and work through the qualification route
- ★ Once you have completed your route you can print it or 'Bookmark' it into your account
- ★ You can also select 'Restart' to explore alternative routes
- ★ Were you aware of the different routes available? Anything that surprised you?
- ★ Want to research another job? Why not check out some other job profiles?

#### Tips to help you

- ★ Take time to consider the different routes on offer (vocational qualifications as well as academic ones)
- ★ Once you have completed your route, you can click 'Find a course' on your route map to find out more about local learning opportunities outside of school
- ★ Some job profiles may not have a qualification route. Look at the 'Getting in' section of this job to find out more

## Follow-up

Young people should continue to familiarise themselves with My World of Work.

Pupils can explore courses and/or volunteering options in the **Learn and train** section on the site.

They can also explore current vacancies and how to apply for them in the **Getting a job** section.
